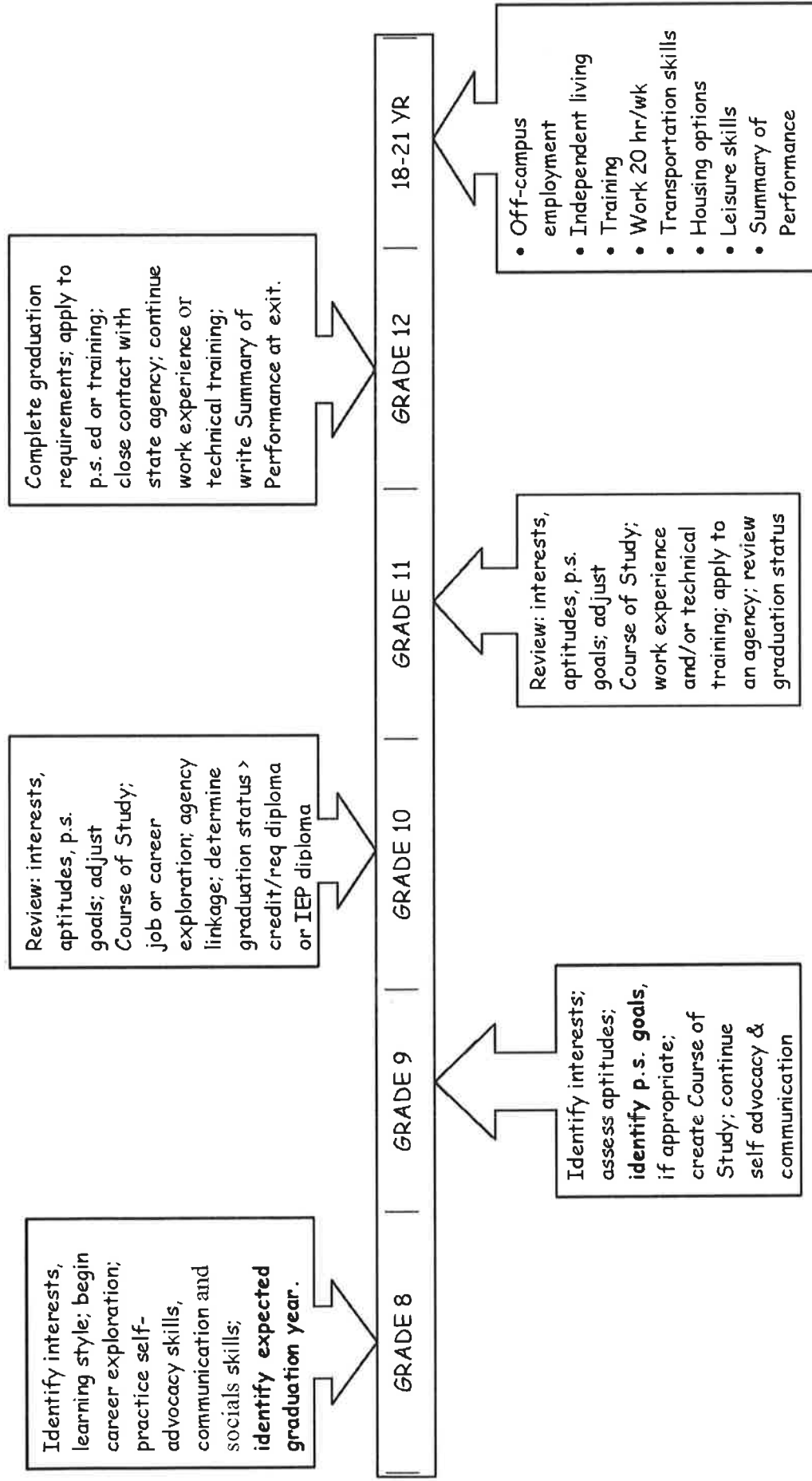

Transition Pointers

1. Students should participate in their Individual Education Program meetings as early and as much as possible.
2. Plan early! Start asking questions about your student's needs during middle school.
3. Help students talk about their dreams and goals
4. All planning is based on the student's strengths, interests, and preferences.
5. Measurable Post-Secondary Goals express what the student wants to do after they leave high school.
6. Plan, develop, and write....classes, educational, and community experiences that relate to what the student wants to do after high school (Course of Study).
7. Work on job, social, and communication skills for employment and community participation. These are all to be included in the student's educational plan.
8. Prepare students to know about the services and supports they will need after high school to help them with their vision.
9. Usually there are long waiting lists for adult services. Get young adults on these lists as soon as possible.
10. Remember that transition planning is: "The Student's Vision" of what he/she wants for his/her future.
